EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. B38-77

WHEREAS, Executive Order B-14-76 established in the Health and Welfare Agency the position of Native American Program Coordinator; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Act for the 1977-78 Fiscal Year transfers the position of Native American Program Coordinator from the Health and Welfare Agency to the Governor's Office;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me as Governor of the State of California:

IT IS ORDERED that the position and budget funds of the Native American Program Coordinator be transferred to the Office of Planning and Research;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the duties of this office, henceforth to be called the Office of American Indian Coordinator, shall be the same as those set forth in Executive Order B-14-76:

- (1) To define the relationship between the Native American population and the state and federal governments.
- (2) To assure that Native Americans are receiving equitable treatment from agencies of the state government.
- (3) To assure that Native American residents of the State of California are receiving all monies which they should be receiving from the federal government, including but not limited to, the National Indian Health Services and the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all state departments and agencies shall cooperate with the American Indian Coordinator and the Native American Heritage Commission in meeting the needs of California's Indian population;

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Executive Order B-14-76 is hereby rescinded.
